Sightseeing in Bayreuth (Festspielhaus, Eremitage...)

Description of Project

The Evangelische Bund Bayern and Österreich in cooperation with the Czech Church of Bohemian Brothers, the University counselors from Bayreuth and Prague and the Institute for Ecumenical Studies and Research Bensheim invite students from Bavaria, Austria and Czech Republic for a weekend in Bayreuth on the theme „War in peaceful times?“.

When? 25-27 November 2022

Where? Youth hostel Bayreuth, Germany

Who? Czech, Austrian and Bavarian students (min. 16 years old) with an interest in international contacts, in this highly relevant topic as well as in insights from different churches and open discussions.

What? „War in peaceful times?“ – Under this theme participants are encouraged to reflect their own attitude to war and pacifism and to engage actively in discussion with each other. The weekend starts off with a lecture by Dekan Sphalinger on “War not Peace in Ukraine, why?”. Different workshops offer a wide variety of approaches to the themes of war and peace. These include getting to know one’s own church tradition and other traditions better, for example, through peace prayers, and hymns, and by dealing with different church positions. We will also look at political issues and discuss current developments with a military chaplain. Other workshops will focus on our own social responsibility (e.g. introduction to nonviolent communication) and on journalistic views of war and peace movements (e.g. on the role of social media in armed conflicts and in peace building, ...). Sightseeing, the traditional Bayreuth Christmas market, and free time for encountering each other and joint activities are also part of the program. The weekend will end with the Protestant university service in the hospital church on Sunday morning, where Pavel Ruml, retired pastor and Lieutenant Colonel in the Reserve and Military Chaplain in the Czech Army, will preach in English (with German translation) and students of the conference will be involved in the service.
